He has served as Organist of the Boston Symphony Orchestra since 1978 and has performed and recorded with major symphony orchestras in Vienna, London, Stuttgart, Koblenz, Paris, Philadelphia, San Francisco, San Diego, Seattle, Baltimore, New York, Boston, etc.

James David Christie holds positions as the Distinguished Artist in Residence at the College of the Holy Cross, Worcester, MA, and Chair and Professor of Organ at the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, Oberlin, OH. On January 14th, Dr. Christie will be performing works by Bach, Alain, Guilmant, Böhm, Langlais, and other great composers on the new Lively-Fulcher Organ.

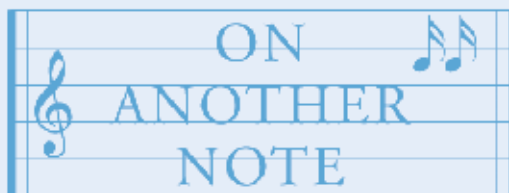
In keeping with our commitment to learning, I want to let you know of another exciting exploration which is taking place. We are currently in conversation with Eden Seminary in St. Louis concerning two possible new programs. First, our church is exploring the possibility of hosting a Seminary Intern over the summer months who will be supervised by our clergy as he or she lends pastoral and worship leadership support to our church. This intern’s stipend will be funded by our Peebles Fund which was set up to help support religious

education beyond college. This intern will be a second-year student who has a passion for preaching and the work of the local church. It is our hope, if all works well, that our first student intern might be among us this summer.

The second discussion with Eden Seminary is around a Theologian in Residence Program. We hope through this program to allow a professor from Eden Seminary to be with us once or twice a year to teach on subjects including Biblical Studies, Historical Christianity, Peace and Justice, and Cultural Shifts in the Christian church, just to name a few. In early February, the President of Eden Seminary, Dr. David Greenlaw, will be here to meet with our staff and our Board of Adult Ministry to discuss further this exciting and cutting-edge program.

As you can see, your church continues to explore ways we can come together and learn what it means to be Christians in the world today. We hope you will want to be a part of these exciting endeavors.

When asked if they would like to live in a new or recently refurbished 3 bdrm/2 bath home which they will eventually own, with a mortgage of about \$500 a month, most renters respond with enthusiasm. When advised they must have a steady income and no debt, some are eliminated until the problem is resolved. When told they and their friends will have to work 600 hours to help build the house, they are willing to begin. When told that groups of volunteers from eight churches will contribute both dollars and labor to make their dream come true, they are amazed and thankful.

Barnabas Program Results

It was late in 2008 when we truly realized that some of our financial institutions and manufacturing firms were near collapse. We realized that we should develop a plan to help those affected by the recession. The Barnabas Program was created and generously funded (\$124,265) with the Easter offering, church funds and subsequent gifts.

The goal has been to help people with housing, hunger and health problems. Our Barnabas leadership team and their numerous volunteers identified non-profit agencies in Indian River County that are experienced in providing solutions. To date we have provided \$75,750 in funding to these agencies, most of which are in the housing and hunger categories. In addition we paid utilities (\$25,550), mortgage/rent (\$9,716), and medical/dental bills (\$3,554) directly to the providers of these services. No Barnabas funds were paid to the 19 individuals. The balance of \$5,500 will be distributed as determined by Barnabas leadership.

Eureka! Did you know that in some English-speaking countries it is unlucky to leave Christmas decorations hanging after the Twelfth Night? Did you know that the Twelfth Night, made famous by William Shakespeare, marks the coming of the Epiphany? This special date that marks the end of one celebration (Christmas!) and the beginning of another (Epiphany) is January 6th.

Epiphany is a day or season that celebrates the Incarnation of Christ and commemorates the visitation of the Magi to the Baby Jesus. All around the world Epiphany is celebrated in different ways. In Italy, Befana visits all the children on the eve of January 6th to fill their socks with candy and presents if they are good or a lump of coal if they are bad (hmm...sounds familiar). In France, the people eat le gateau des Rois (King Cake) which holds a trinket or bean hidden inside the cake. The person who gets the piece of cake with the trinket becomes “king” for a day. In Mexico, it is tradition for kids to leave their shoes, along with a letter with toy requests for the Three Kings by the family

Nativity Scene. In northern Mexico, the shoes may be filled with hay for the camels, so that the Kings will be generous with their gifts. In southern India, they celebrate Epiphany in front of the church much like a fair. Families will come together and cook Pongal, sweet rice porridge.

In Vero Beach, we will start a new tradition! On Sunday, January 9th, we will commemorate Epiphany with a Family Worship Service in the Community Hall. This family service will celebrate and contemplate the visit of the Magi who followed a star in search of a new hope. We encourage the families of Community Church to join us on Sunday, January 9th, for a spiritual journey that will catapult your hope and beliefs. Afterwards, please join us at our Epiphany Bowling Party from noon to 1:30 p.m. at the new Vero Bowl. Cost is \$5.00 per person and includes one hour of bowling, shoe rental, one slice of pizza and a drink.
