In addition, we will be joined by the youth and leaders from all over Florida who are attending the UCC Fall Youth Retreat "Imagine all the People" (see page 4) and our Children's Ministry will be participating in a special procession of the elements in honor of World-Wide Communion Sunday.

It is our hope to be able to share this worship with you in celebration of the many ways that we are called not just here, in this time and in this place, but from centuries before to generations to come, and from within this community to our profound world abroad. We hope to see you there!

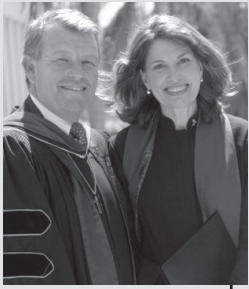

Seeking the Celtic Spirit

This coming May we will take a group of travelers from Community Church to sites of significance among early Celtic Christians in Ireland, Scotland, and England. Many of these sites share two important characteristics: they are breathtakingly beautiful and they are isolated. The Celts chose these sites for building their monasteries and places of worship because such wild and unmanageable landscapes were thought to be “thin places,” where the dividing wall between the divine and the ordinary was thinner. Here, they believed, the unpredictable and uncontrollable aspects of nature they encountered could be a means of discovery – deep spiritual discovery.

Today, when modes of modern transportation make virtually every spot on the globe easily accessible, we still marvel at our Celtic Christian sisters and brothers who braved danger to strike out into the unknown and uncharted wild places where they could listen and learn from nature about God, its creator.

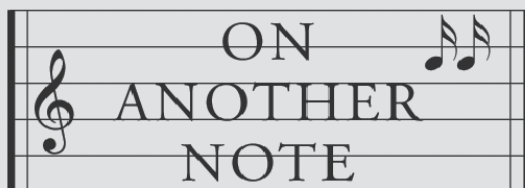
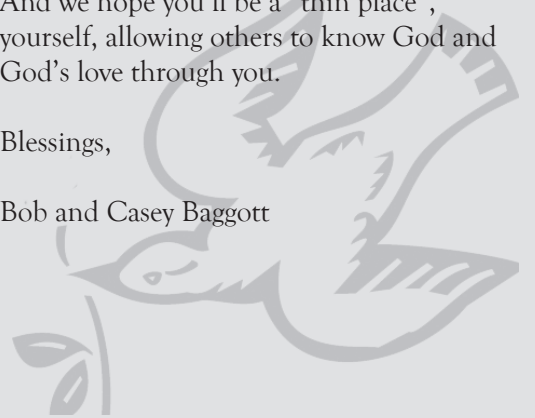
One modern poet, David R. Leigh, in his poem, “Thin Places – a Prayer,” invites us, as modern believers, into the spirit of the early Celts. He says:

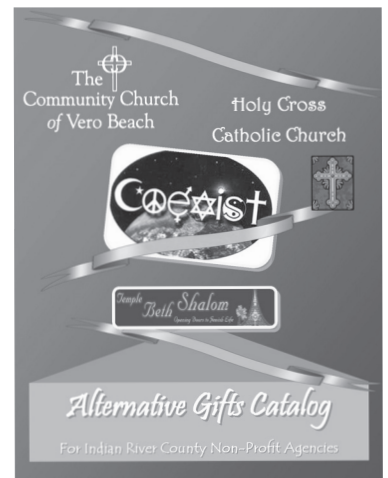

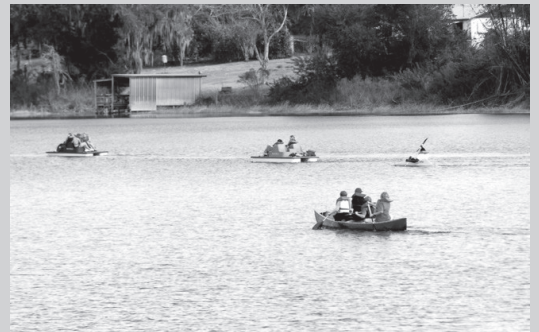

Board Focus - Board of Trustees

The mission of the Board of Trustees is to oversee the business affairs of the church, manage its real and personal property, and secure its short and long-term integrity. Each board member is expected to serve on one or more of the following committees:

The Finance Committee - responsible for preparing the annual budget for review and recommendations to the board, to audit the investments and spending of the church accounts and to make appropriate recommendations for full board action.

The Endowment Committee - oversees the establishment and maintenance of all endowments and insures the terms of these funds are carried out in accordance with the intention of the fund's donor(s).

The Personnel Committee is responsible for all personnel matters that pertain to the church staff and employees.

The Preschool Committee works directly with the Director and their Advisory Board with matters that concern the Preschool.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee is responsible for the care and maintenance of all church facilities and makes suggestions to the board for appropriate insuring of the facilities for fire and liability.

This board convenes on the third Thursday of each month. Current board members are: Rob Kenney, Chair, Brian Connolly, Eileen Raynolds, Sally Toffey, Jim Balph, Kay Hammond, Larry Leonard, Phil Bartlett, Phil Long, Tom Sinclair, Trent Leyda and Wheatie Gibb. While the Church Moderator, Treasurer and Senior Minister are not considered voting members of the board, they are invited to attend board meetings to provide insight and guidance.

TO YOUR HEALTH!



If you have osteoporosis, the exercises frequently recommended include strength training, flexibility, balance, and weight bearing aerobic exercises. But, do you know what to avoid? Any exercise or activity in which you bend forward or twist at the spine such as touching toes or stomach crunches should be avoided. These movements cause increased pressure on the bones in your spine which can increase your risk for compression fractures.

Saving energy in a household can involve some simple habit changing. Here's an example: Say you're a person who always washes your face before brushing your teeth. Your bathroom is on the upper floor of a two-story house, and it takes a while for the hot water to make its way up the two floors and finally into the faucet at the sink. To save a bit of energy and water, try brushing your teeth first before you wash your face. You're going to use cold water to brush your teeth anyway, so why not use that first portion of cold water at the hot water tap to do the job?
